LABELLA RE: BOILER STUDY

Michael Barbasch and Aaron Schauger from LaBella provided the Board of Trustees with the results of the Biomass Boiler Study. The study showed what biomass is, the engineering analysis, proposed biomass layout, economic analysis and carbon emissions analysis. The Board has two options:

- 1. Install 1 new oil boiler and a biomass boiler
- 2. Install 2 new oil boilers

The Water Treatment Plant currently has 2 oil boilers, one of which is not working. The Village will need to do something in the near future. LaBella stated that NYSERDA funding is available to help with the cost of the biomass boiler.
