DISCUSSION: By Bill Witmann, building owner. Mr. Wittmann had questions regarding what a Historic Building Owner is allowed to do if his building is destroyed.

DISCUSSION: The building owners of private homes at 31 W. Park St. and 113 S. Main St had questions regarding how the

Historic District affects them, and if they have the right to 'opt out'

DISCUSSION: By Michael Bonafede about the boundaries of the District, and why it was not extended North of the Canal.

DISCUSSION; Members of the Christ Church asked the HPC to consider that churches are different historical buildings; they have different visions and different goals. Christ Church had an issue with an

outhouse that was eventually demolished.

Mr. Conrad Cropsey requested a copy of the correspondence between the Christ Church and the HPC. The representatives of the Church will get copies to the HPC, Linda Smith to deliver copies to Mr. Cropsey for his review.

DISCUSSION: The possibility of creating an email list from the sign up sheet from the public forum, and notifying interested parties when meetings occur.

MOTION: By Mary Anne to adjourn at 8:40, seconded by Aric, passed unanimously.
