To whom it may concern,

First, I'd like to thank Chief Mogle and Lieutenant Annable for the opportunity to start my career in Law Enforcement. Without those two taking a chance with me, I would not be where I am today. The decision to leave the Albion Police Department was not an easy one for me. I have made many friendships here and have had an amazing opportunity to grow as a person. The Albion Police Department has been a second family for me the past three years.

While working here, the one thing I think could be improved is more accountability for actions and words. One thing I loved about working at Albion was seeing how close this department has been with surrounding departments. It is sad to see those relationships go rocky or see people inside the department not wanting to work with other people.

Going into my interview with this other department I was not set on my decision yet. During my interview I met the Town Supervisor along with a few other people. The way the Town Supervisor spoke about the Police Department was shocking. The Town Supervisor spoke about the future showing they want nothing but the best for the Officer's employed there. In my three years at Albion, I have not seen that support from the Village Mayor or Deputy Mayor. It was extremely upsetting to see our Union and the Village spend so much money on lawyers for everyone to settle on something so simple and miniscule. Not only was that upsetting, it was upsetting to see the contracts the Village offered along the way. Currently there is not support towards the Albion Police Department.

There were a few other benefits that helped me make my decision. One being an Investigator position. I see this as an opportunity to grow and excel in my future. Currently, Albion only has the

Sergeant position to move up. With the ages of everyone at the department currently, I know that it could be a long time before I saw the opportunity to become a Sergeant. When I first got hired at Albion, there was the opportunity for the School Resource Officer Position. Shortly after, the County took that position over. I was given false hope that the Village Board was going to fight hard for Albion to be back in the school. Another benefit was lifetime medical after retirement. This was a benefit that is very hard to turn away from especially with hopes of starting my own family in the future. I also have the opportunity for compensatory time. This gives me the option of working overtime for more time off instead of taking the overtime in my paycheck. It was hard for me to see this as an option at Albion when our contract negotiations went the way they did this year. Lastly, this department does have higher wages than Albion and a huge amount of overtime opportunities. It was very disappointing when our schedules had to be changed around for trainings in order to limit the amount of overtime made.

I truly am grateful for the relationships I have gained here and the growth I have done within this career and as a person. I have had consistent support and respect from Chief Mogle and Lieutenant Annable, which truly has meant a lot. I hope that whoever steps foot into the Village next election gives this department the respect and support the Officer's deserve.
